SENSE OF BELONGING

A uniform helps children feel that they belong to a particular organization even after many years of schooling. Now, this is yet another reason why school uniform is essential.

FOCUS ON THE RIGHT THINGS

Children who wear school uniform concentrate well on their studies. They do not get as distracted. They will do better in academics. Kids do not compete with their peers as much.

UNITY IN DIVERSITY

Kids from a range of different families and economic conditions come to the school. Since there is a lot of differences among the students, it is the school uniform that acts as a catalyst in making them unite as one body.

INCREASES CONFIDENCE AND RESPECT

Students that wear school uniform act responsibly and respectful to the teachers. In turn, promoting a positive and respectful environment.

REDUCES STRESS FOR PARENTS

If a school does not have a school uniform in place, it is more difficult for the parents. Every day, they have to consider what clothes their kids should wear to school.



Come teach ethics at Dungog Public School

We are building an ethics program at Dungog Public School with lessons delivered by Primary Ethics

In ethics, students explore everyday issues suitable for their age. They learn to listen closely to each other, to disagree without putdowns and to think carefully as they form their opinions.

We have children on waitlists and want to give them the opportunity to take part in ethics. To do that we need more volunteers to teach.

You can teach ethics if:

- You're interested in what children think and you have an interest in learning
- You're willing to learn how to use our lesson scripts to ask children ethical questions
- You can remain neutral and give the children space
- You're available each school week at 2:00pm every 2nd Wednesday for a 40 minute lesson. You'll need about an hour each week to prepare and give the scripted lesson
- You complete our free training, pass background checks and comply with Department of Education requirements



You will join a great community of Primary Ethics volunteers across NSW. You'll have the rewarding opportunity of listening to the fantastic students at our school and helping them grow. You'll develop new skills yourself - facilitation skills, plus skills in communication and active listening Primary Ethics provides free, comprehensive training with online self-paced learning plus trainer-led

workshops (by Zoom or face-to-face).


