Message from the Principal

What an amazing Term 3 we have had..... lots of learning experiences for our students in the classroom and on the sporting field.

2-6B



Chaplain News - HOW MUCH EXERCISE DO OUR KIDS NEED?

Physical activity is vital for children's health, wellbeing and development, now and in the future. Physical activity strengthens children's bones, muscles, hearts and lungs; improves children's coordination, balance, posture and flexibility and helps children stay at a healthy weight.

Physical activity reduces children's risk of getting heart disease, cancer, type-2 diabetes later in life, and is an essential to boost kids overall well-being. How much exercise do kids need?

Children aged **5 years up to 18 years should do at least one hour of moderate to vigorous physical activity plus several hours of light physical activity each day**. At least three days a week, this should include activities that strengthen muscles and bones.
